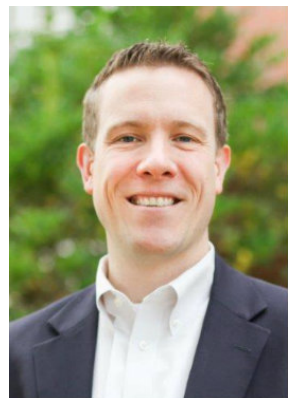

**Rev. Dr. Paul C.H. Lim** – has taught at Cambridge University, Gordon-Conwell Seminary, and Vanderbilt University; currently Associate Professor of the History of Christianity at Vanderbilt; his last book, *Mystery Unveiled: The Crisis of the Trinity in Early Modern England* (Oxford University Press, 2012) has received the prestigious Roland H. Bainton Prize in the Sixteenth Century Society & Conference as the best book in History/Theology in 2013; serving as the President of the American Society of Church History (ASCH) for 2019; has served as an Editorial Board member for Brill's "Studies in the History of Christian Traditions" series since 2010; currently serving as the Scholar-in-Residence at Christ Presbyterian Church in Nashville, USA.

**Rev. Dr. Gabriel N.E. Fluhrer** – ordained in 2008; received his Ph.D. from Westminster Theological Seminary in 2015; Minister of Discipleship in First Presbyterian Church, Columbia, SC, since 2017; served as church planter and founding pastor of Shiloh Presbyterian Church in Raleigh, NC, from 2011-2015 and Minister of Discipleship at First Presbyterian Church, Jackson, MS, from 2015-2017; edited three books published by P&R Publishers; serves as an adjunct faculty member of Reformed Theological Seminary; a regular contributor to *Tabletalk* Magazine.
